SCOTT COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING TUESDAY, MAY 4, 2010

The Scott County School Board met in regular session on Tuesday, May 4, 2010, in the School Board Office Conference Room in Gate City, Virginia, with the following members present:

<u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: Mr. James Kay Jessee, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 6 p.m. and members of the audience cited the *Pledge of Allegiance*.

<u>APPROVAL OF AGENDA</u>: On a motion by Mrs. McClelland, seconded by Mr. Templeton, all members voting aye, the Board approved the agenda as presented.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Ms. Gina Bishop, Duffield Primary School Parent, presented comments of support and a petition on behalf of parents at Duffield Primary School, which she stated contained 150 signatures from those wanting the current school secretary, Ms. Teresa Williams, to remain as secretary next school year.

Mrs. Suzanne Goins, Virginia Professional Educators Representative, expressed thanks on behalf of herself and her father, for the citing of the *Pledge of Allegiance* as had been suggested by her father at a previous meeting.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: On a motion by Mr. Campbell, seconded by Mrs. McClelland, all members voting aye, the Board approved the minutes of the March 31, 2010 Regular Meeting as submitted.

APPROVAL OF CLAIMS: On a motion by Mr. Templeton, seconded by Mrs. Blair, all members voting aye, the Board approved payroll and claims as follows: School Operating Fund invoices and payroll in the amount of \$3,258,241.55 as shown by warrants #8095200-8095580 (#8095277 &8095573 voided) and \$1,159,643.60 electronic payroll deposit and \$577784.88 electronic payroll tax deposit. Cafeteria Fund invoices and payroll in the amount of \$179,701.69 as shown by warrants #1012906-1012998 and \$11,352.04 electronic tax deposit. Head Start invoices and payroll in the amount of \$73,908.58 as shown by warrants #8744-8821.

PRESENTATION FROM SPECIAL EDUCATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE

REPRESENTATIVE: Mr. Chad Griffin, Special Education Advisory Committee Representative,

expressed gratitude to the board for their past support. He stated that the committee is aware of the current economic situation facing this county and therefore no requests for improvement are being made for next school year. He presented figures on the number of special education students served, the various personnel currently employed for the program and personnel cuts being made to next year's program. He reported that a transition coordinator continues to be needed for the program. He requested that should funding become available again that the special needs program be restored to the full potential positions. He presented several positive comments on the Applied Behavioral Analysis program that was begun in the school division a couple of years ago and on the successful progress his child has made in the program. He also commented that the school division also has one of the finest preschool programs in the region. He expressed that the special needs program has come a long way and doesn't want to see it go back.

APPROVAL OF PART B, SECTION 611, FLOW-THROUGH FUNDS AND PART B, SECTION 619, PRESCHOOL FUNDS: On the recommendation of Mrs. Brenda P. Robinette, Director of Special Education, and on a motion by Mr. Campbell, seconded by Mrs. Blair, all members voting aye, the Board approved the Part B, Section 611 Flow-Through Funds as presented in the amount of \$825,583. On the recommendation of Mrs. Robinette and on a motion by Mrs. Blair, seconded by Mr. Campbell, all members voting aye, the Board approved the Part B, Section 619, Preschool Funds as presented in the amount of \$31,452. Mrs. Robinette also explained that if funding is not spent in one category it will be transferred to a line item of need. Mrs. Robinette provided last year's figures for the grants per Mr. Meade's question regarding a comparison of this year's figures to last year's.

<u>ITEMS BY BOARD MEMBERS:</u> Mr. Campbell asked Superintendent Scott about an update for next year's nursing program at the schools. Superintendent Scott reported that more students continue to need shots and it is more of a liability concern for the school system as the personnel providing the shots must be properly licensed. He hopes to have the same number of nurses as last year and reported that there will be one more RN available. He explained that placement of nurses at the schools is according to student needs.

Chairman Jessee suggested surveying former students to determine how well the school system is doing in preparing students for college. Mrs. McClelland thought it would be interesting to see how many completed any post secondary programs, including cosmetology, welding, etc. Chairman Jessee asked members to think about this and maybe come back with ideas and suggestions at the next meeting.

Superintendent Scott reported that the school division receives requests from different agencies and groups for this information. He commented a better job needs to be done with this.

APPROVAL OF HEAD START FY2010 ARRA COLA FUNDS & QUALITY IMPROVEMENT:

On the recommendation of Superintendent Scott and on a motion by Mr. Templeton, seconded by Mrs. McClelland, all members voting aye, the Board approved the Head Start FY2010 ARRA COLA funds in the amount of \$12,400 for six months, July 1 to December 31, 2010, salaries and fringe benefits and the full month revenue added to the FY2011 Head Start Grant. Superintendent Scott explained that this request was previously approved by the Head Start Policy Council.

APPROVAL OF HEAD START PERSONNEL FOR 2010-2011 SCHOOL YEAR: On the recommendation of Superintendent Scott and on a motion by Mr. Campbell, seconded by Mrs. McClelland, all members voting aye, the Board approved the list of Head Start Personnel for the 2010-2011 school year as was previously approved by the Head Start Policy Council:

APPROVAL OF GRANT APPLICATIONS: Superintendent Scott explained that the federal grant applications have just become available today for downloading from the website. He further explained that the applications must be completed prior to the next school board meeting in June and therefore he is making the request for approval of level funding at this time. On the recommendation of Superintendent Scott and on a motion by Mrs. Blair, seconded by Mr. Meade, all members voting aye, the Board approved grant applications for level funding and should additional funds become available they would be added to the following grant applications:

Title I, Part A – Improving Basic Programs (level funding)

Title I, Part C – Education of Migratory Children (level funding: participation in the Southwest Virginia Title IC Migrant Consortium through Carroll County Schools

Title II, Part A – Teacher Quality (level funding)

Title II, Part D – Educational Technology (level funding)

Title III, Part A – Language Instruction for Limited English Proficient and Immigrant Students (level funding: participation in the Southwest Virginia Consortium through Carroll County Schools)

DISCUSSION AND APPROVAL OF FUNDING FOR IMAGINATION LIBRARY OF SCOTT

COUNTY: Superintendent Scott passed out a handout that contained a letter from Mr. M.A. Lunsford, *Imagination Library of Scott County*, as well as letters of support from two other agencies. He reported that funds for the *Imagination Library of Scott County* have been included in the school budget should board members choose to fund the program.

Mr. M.A. Lunsford, *Imagination Library of Scott County* Representative, pointed out that the issue at a prior meeting was the Memorandum of Agreement presented. He informed board members the County Board of Supervisors voted to approve \$5,000 in funding contingent upon the school board doing the same. He also reported as they could see in the letters provided to them that both Dr. Gary Michael, Scott County United Way Representative, and the Scott County Rotary Club's funding is contingent upon school board funds as well. He informed the Board that he would be glad to answer any questions at any time about the program.

Mr. Templeton presented comments of support in agreement with funding the program. Mr. Meade expressed a concern in funding the program with the school system laying off personnel and also expressed, once again, that it has always been a problem with him that "Dolly" benefits (publicity) from the program but does not contribute funds to the program. Mr. Meade further expressed that he feels this way even more so now due to the current economic situation and doesn't believe in taking away from the school system to support the program. Mr. Campbell asked about the timeframe of the funding commitment and it was discussed that the funding would be for one year only. Mrs. McClelland pointed out that the school board could not legally obligate funds for more than one year. In answer to Mrs. Blair's question concerning the amount of the funding request, Mr. Lunsford reported that \$3,000 had been paid previously by the school board and board of supervisors and that this is the second request for funding.

Mr. Templeton made a motion to approve the amount of \$5,000.00 as one year funding for the *Imagination Library of Scott County*, motion was seconded by Mr. Campbell.

On the recommendation of Superintendent Scott and on a motion by Mrs. Katherine "Kathy" J. McClelland, seconded by Mr. Meade, all members voting aye, the Board approved the 2010-2011 School Operating Fund and School Cafeteria Fund Budgets as presented. **(Appendix A)**

<u>DISCUSSION CONCERNING ENERGY AUDIT PROPOSAL</u>: Superintendent Scott presented a copy of a Twin Springs High School energy audit, which was prepared by The Philips Lighting Group located in Johnson City, Tennessee. He explained that the company is available to present a more in depth energy audit proposal and payment information at the next school board meeting should members wish them to do so. He reported that the audit is being conducted at no cost to the school system and if members are interested other schools can be done.

Mrs. McClelland asked about obtaining a cost per square foot and suggested checking to see if there are energy grants available.

Superintendent Scott reported that with this particular energy proposal savings are up front and the company is paid back based on the savings. It was discussed that it would be a savings if the school system does some of the work itself.

Mr. Meade commented that this item came up at a previous meeting. He reported that the school system has already done work on windows and doors and this has been money well spent. He

further commented that maybe some funds can be saved by doing this project and he doesn't have a problem with doing it if it pays for itself.
