<u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: Chairman Jessee called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. He welcomed everyone and expressed appreciation for their attendance and interest in the school system.

MOMENT OF SILENCE/PATRIOT DAY 2011: Chairman Jessee recognized Kathy McClelland, board member, prior to the moment of silence. Mrs. McClelland stated that this is the week that we are remembering the events of September 11, 2001 that had a profound effect on the United States and continues to be found to this day. She also stated that these events touched not only the lives of Americans but 92 other nations. She further stated that on September 11 over 3,000 of our own citizens were killed by terrorist attacks. Mrs. McClelland asked that, this week as we remember September 11, let us honor the lives that were destroyed, the sacrifices that were made and the bravery that was shown. She invited everyone to the First Presbyterian Church on Sunday at 4 p.m. in Scott County for remembrance of 9/11.

Patriot Day 2011

Whereas, on this 10th observance of Patriot Day we remember and honor those who perished in the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001, and from that tragedy we celebrate the emergence of a stronger Nation that has come together to defend America and advance freedom; and

Whereas, on that day and in its aftermath, we witnessed incredible acts of heroism from firefighters, police officers, emergency personnel and everyday citizens, many of whom sacrificed their own lives in their efforts to save others; and

Whereas, in the months and years that have followed since the tragic events of September 11, our country's resilient recovery can be attributed to the outpouring of compassion, assistance and contributions from all around the world to not only help the victims and their families but to strengthen the unity and spirit of the American people; and

Whereas, we are grateful to our brave men and women in uniform who have made daily sacrifices both on U.S. soil and tours around the globe to defend our liberty and combat terrorism; and

Whereas, through a resolution approved by Congress and enacted into law we observe September 11 of each year as Patriot Day and as ordered by the President of the United States will display all U.S. flags at half-staff from sunrise to sunset; and

Now, therefore, we, the School Board of Scott County, Virginia, do hereby recognize, September 11, 2011, as Patriot Day and call upon the students and staff of Scott County Schools to observe this day with appropriate ceremonies and activities to honor the memory of the innocent lives lost, to reaffirm our commitment as a Democratic Nation, and to remain vigilant in our opposition to terrorism across the globe.

<u>PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE</u> Chairman Jessee recognized Ms. Pat Carroll, DAR Representative, who led the audience in citing the *Pledge of Allegiance*.

CONSTITUTION WEEK SEPTEMBER 17-23: Mrs. McClelland, board member, stated that tonight the Board is going to sign a proclamation to celebrate the U.S. Constitution. She also stated that September 17, 2011 begins the national celebration of Constitution Week, which is a week-long commemoration of America's most important document— the one our country probably knows the least about but stands as a testament to the tenacity of Americans throughout history to maintain the liberty, freedoms and to ensure that those inalienable rights are there for every American. She further stated that the United States serves as a republic under the constitution, which is the oldest document still active that outlines the self-government of the people. She commented that we must remember that those who wrote the constitution believed that no government can create freedom, but that government must guard freedom rather than encroach upon the freedom of its people. She asked the audience to remember on September 17 to fly their flag all week and to be proud that they are a part of a country that has a constitution that has survived this many years. She further commented that even though there is turmoil in this country we are still functioning and it's a good place to live and be proud of.

Some of the school's students did a presentation and teachers read a poem to the students. Chairs in the meeting room had a picture of each of the school's students along with a description of what the student wanted to learn.

IMAGINATION LIBRARY OF SCOTT COUNTY DONATION REQUEST TABLED: Interim

Superintendent Ferguson reported that the *Imagination Library of Scott County* is requesting a donation from Scott County Public Schools for the 2011-2012 school year in the amount of \$5,000.

It was discussed that the Appalachian Community Action has been the fiscal agent for the *Imagination Library of Scott County* for the past 8 months to a year and that maybe the item should be tabled until checking further with the agency. Further discussion was it was thought that at the time the last donation was made the Board was not under any obligation due to the difficulty of the Board's finances. Mrs. McClelland suggested that maybe the RTI (Response To Intervention Program) that is being put in may be a better use of \$5,000 in funds since it is spread out among all students and pointed out that the only children benefiting from the *Imagination Library* are those that their parents take the initiative to sign them up.

Interim Superintendent Ferguson was questioned about the availability of funds in regard to the request and he reported that it is going to be very close in all funding. He suggested that this item be tabled at the present time and see where we are at the conclusion of the school year.

Mr. Templeton made a motion to table the donation request from the *Imagination Library of Scott County* until a later date; motion was seconded by Mrs. Blair, all members voting aye.

BUILDING SERVICES WORK ORDERS – ROBERT SALLEE, DIRECTOR OF BUILDING SERVICES:

Robert Sallee, Director of Building Services, provided Board members a copy of all open work orders at the present time and a copy of the closed work orders completed during the time that Mr. Sallee has been director since September 1. He provided a report on different aspects of the work orders in regard to the employees going out to the jobs each day doing as many orders as they can, the varied timeframes for completion of jobs, etc. Also, in response to a Board member question, he provided an update of repairs necessary to the bleachers at Gate City High School Stadium.





The Future of NCLB

- Secretary of Education announced that he will unilaterally override the centerpiece requirement school accountability law, that 100 percent of students be proficient in math and reading by 2014.
- Duncan announced he will provide a process for states to seek relief from key provisions of the law, with the specifics to be announced next month (October.)
- The Reauthorization of NCLB is expected to center on career and college readiness.
