New <u>EL Education Website</u> Design and Resources

New ELD Standards Framework coming out Fall 2020

According to WIDA, there will be new instructional materials that support implementing English Language Development Standards in every content and ESL classroom with an EL. Prior ELD Standards Framework Editions and other supplemental materials and resources are likely to be retired. Stay tuned for more information, including fall professional learning opportunities to learn about the new materials.

SYLLABLE Act Promotes Access to Dual Language Immersion Programs

On February 5th, Rep. Raúl M. Grijalva introduced the Supporting Young Language Learners' Access to Bilingual Education (SYLLABLE) Act in the House of Representatives. The bill helps establish high-quality dual-language immersion programs in communities with high numbers of low-income families and supports those programs from pre-K to 5th grade.

New Newsletter Delivery System

The Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) is launching GovDelivery for all of its mass communications and electronic newsletters! GovDelivery is a web-based software system provided by Granicus that allows VDOE offices to deliver messages to subscribers and manage subscriptions. GovDelivery allows interested subscribers to receive a variety of email updates from VDOE, including enewsletters, daily news clips, and public meeting notices based on their individual needs and interests. Future *EL News and Notes* will be delivered by this new system.

In-state tuition for undocumented college students

Any student who has attended a Virginia high school for at least two years, regardless of citizenship, would be eligible for in-state tuition at state colleges and universities under bills passed by the House and Senate.

Scholarship Opportunities:

2020 Granville P. Meade Scholarship

The Granville P. Meade Scholarship provides financial assistance to students who have achieved academically, but who are financially unable to attend college. The Fund awards scholarships to eligible Virginia high school seniors to attend one of Virginia's public or private colleges or universities. The Ellevation Scholarship Program

Ellevation has established a scholarship program to assist students who plan to continue their education in college or vocational school programs. Applications are open from now until March 16th. Ellevation will be awarding five (5) \$2,000 scholarships to deserving EL students to pursue a higher education and achieve their highest aspirations. Global Storybooks: freely available digital tales in 50+ languages: Providing ELs access to reading materials in their primary languages is a research-based instructional practice. The University of British Columbia developed Global Storybooks, an open, multilingual literacy portal that offers books to more than 40 countries and regions. The goal is to nurture language learning and support literacy.

<u>Motivational Framework for Culturally Responsive ESL Teaching</u>: This article, through a deep, classroom-driven research project, explores the benefits of four aspects of a motivational framework: inclusion, attitude, meaning, and competence. Classroom strategies and activities are included.

<u>Serving Immigrant and Undocumented Students</u>: Natasha Quiroga, a lawyer who directs the Parental Readiness and Empowerment Program at the Washington, D.C.-based Lawyers' Committee for Civil Rights Under Law, shares advice with educators around best practices for immigrant students and families.
